# Wear of the de Fleury Medal



## Proper Wear



Proper wear of the de Fleury Medal is shown above. The ribbon is on the outside of the shirt collar, but inside the jacket collar. The medal is on the inside of the jacket, above the top button with the helmeted Soldier facing out in view.

## Most Common Mistakes in Wearing the de Fleury Medal



The medal is **not** to hang outside the jacket.



The ribbon is **not** to be worn on the inside of the shirt collar.



The ribbon is **not** to be worn on the outside of the jacket collar.

**Army service uniform and white mess uniform:** The medal will be worn with the ribbon around the neck, outside the shirt collar and inside the coat collar. The medal will hang over the four-in-hand necktie near the collar and above the top button of the coat or just under the bow tie or neck tab near the collar and above the top button of the coat. Proper positioning may necessitate pinning the ribbon together approximately 3 inches from the ribbon ends.
